Stubbington's Mark Le Gassick was a minute and 40 seconds behind with Aldershot's Paddy McCourt a further 19 seconds back in third. Emma Patel (Also from Winchester had a narrower win in the ladies race but was still over 30 seconds clear of New Forest runner Erica Fogg with another Winchester runner, Natalie Cain third.

The club interest was led home by Lee who peaked his training to perfection to hold off Pete by 7 seconds. Sean, I believe, took 7 minutes off his course best to emphasise what an improvement he has made since joining the Harriers. Greg was our only other runner to break the 30 minute barrier, ahead of club all rounder Dave Bush. Another close grouping saw Richard take the honours over the very fast finishing Tim who managed to pass Neil in the closing stages.



Cath put in a superb run to finish 5<sup>th</sup> lady and was only 7 seconds behind the third place runner. Andy Hartley beat Dave Maughan in the battle of the club exiles while Rachel put in another stormer to beat off the challenge of Steve. Keith was home next ahead of Michael who, like Sean, made a big improvement on last year's run. This was the clubs second attempt at this event and hopes were high that we could improve on last year's performance. Our chances of doing so were improved when Greg announced that he would be in Australia when the race was on (provided he did not get lost on his way to the other side of the world). Paige again volunteered to drive the school bus that carried the squad to the start and then dashed to the handover points along the course.

As guest timekeeper / spectator / beer drinker I have to say how impressed with every runner. Obviously the race meant something to each one of them and all ran themselves into the ground so as not to let their team mates down. Here the Winchester runner who had been 2<sup>nd</sup> took a wrong turning so though Richard had still handed over 4<sup>th</sup> there was a possibility of the stewards lifting us to third. Bushy ran strongly to Romsey without getting lost, resulting in a couple of the club comics texting Greg with the good news (even though we estimated it to be about 3am local time in Sydney).

Keith saved his best performance in some time for this event and handed over to Jamie still in 4<sup>th</sup> place. The team spirit displayed by each individual was shown on the last leg as they positioned themselves along Jamie's route and navigated him to the finish through the streets of Totton.
