STUBBINGTON 10km

JANUARY 11th.

This years Stubbington 10 km doubled up as both a Hants. Road race league fixture and the County championships. Following a day after the Ashe Meadows cross-country we were surprised that so many members turned out to make a very busy weekend with no less than six of our members doing both events. Jamie led us home with a moderate race for him in ideal conditions with no rain and only a light breeze coming in off the sea. However he did manage 15th place in an entry of over 1200 with nearly 900 finishers.

Dave Vosser completed a double fixture despite injury problems, which seem to dog him these days. This was, it appears, to be reflected in his moderate time of 37:58. The other Dave (Maughn) seems to be improving with very race and was only half a minute behind Voss. Andy Hartley completed the Road race team of four with a solid run in 77th spot to record 39:18. Eric proved again to be our only prize winner taking 3rd place O/60 overall but took the silver medal in the County championship. Dave Titcomb was only a minute behind and breathing down Eric's neck after being passed by him earlier in the race. Frank made a rare appearance in a road race and seemed pleased with his performance to record 48:50, whilst JT recorded a personal worst for 10km after suffering a period of running on the spot at the beginning having gotten caught up in the sheer weight of numbers.

To complete our interest in the race Belinda managed to achieve her target by ducking under the hour by about half a minute.

Some Juniors Results from Geoff

On Saturday 17 January, 14 year old Josh Bliss and 15 year old Aaron Harris, both students at Testbourne School Whitchurch, together with 16 year old Craig Williams, a student at Brighton Hill School Basingstoke were in action at the Hampshire Schools Cross Country Championships at Ansty Park Alton. The 5.4Km course was pretty well flat, but the going was deceptively tough, due to recent heavy rains.

The three boys went with the initial manic dash, and quickly settled down with the lead group of six. By halfway this group had splintered, with Josh finding himself locked in a battle for second place, and Craig and Aaron fighting for fourth place in a group of three, some twenty metres behind. Aaron dropped off the pace towards the end of the race but still came in a respectable 6th, whilst Craig broke away with about 800metres left, to finish 4th. Josh managed to pull away from his nearest opponent but could not catch the leader, and finished in a fantastic 2nd place. These results mean that all three boys will represent Hampshire in the English Schools Cross Country Championships at Maidstone, Kent in March.

Stubbington Green 10 Km 11th January 2004 Race Report by Frank Kenny

My first outing for about 18 months due to a long-term injury was always going to be tough, both mentally and physically. Leaving Whitchurch in plenty of time the weather looked like it was going to play a major part in the day's events but as I neared the small centre of Stubbington the rain moved away, the clouds broke up and the wind died down to leave an almost perfect mid-winter morning. My main objective of the day was to get round comfortably and to enjoy the experience of racing again.

The organisation at this event is always good and the pre-race atmosphere was very positive and encouraging. Not being sure how I would fare I ran the first kilometre very conservatively, staying toward the back of the main field. As the race progressed I picked up my own pace, passing JT at around 2.5 km and for the next 30 mins I was regularly overtaking people. Even better than that I was running at a consistent pace and enjoying it to boot! All good things come to an end though and as I reached 8km life was decidedly uncomfortable. (Nothing new there then!) The last 2 km were spent in the company of three runners from Gosport and a Portsmouth lady. The sprint finish just wasn't there but I ended up ahead of the contingent from Gosport but behind Portsmouth.

I was very tired but satisfied that I had kept going over the last 10 minutes. I had had a good run for me and, well, that was very nearly the best bit of the day. Drink in hand I headed to the rest of the Overton group and was given a round of applause! Many thanks guys, it was very much appreciated and made me realise just what a fantastic atmosphere there is within the club. It didn't matter what my time was, the fact that I had run in club colours and had the effort recognised at the end was a very nice moment.

From post race chats it seemed that most people had a reasonable run. The weather stayed dry, the spectators were excellent and Stubbington Green Runners put on a very enjoyable race. Together with a very flat course you can see why this draws such a large field. It is a great loosener after Christmas and New Year and long may it continue. Roll on Eastleigh. Who knows, I might even aim for a time there!
